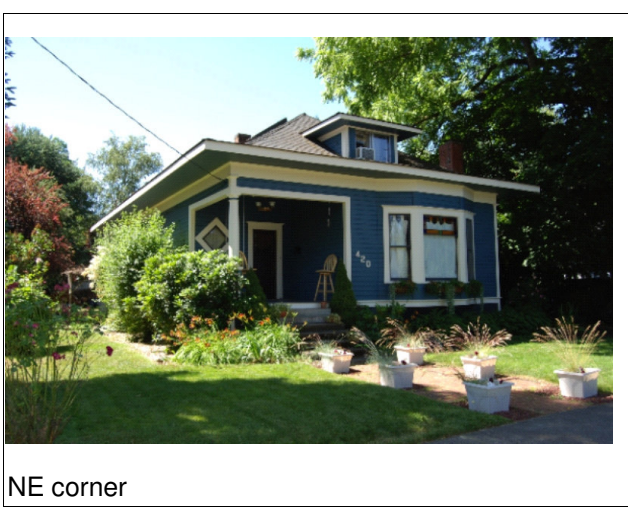

ARCHITECTURAL / PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

This simple one-story residence features a low-pitched bell cast hipped roof and a polygonal bay with leaded glass in the upper sash of the largest window which lights the main living space. The house exhibits fine detail work: the corner boards have pilaster capitals, the foundation is clad with shingles, the frieze is wide, and the eaves are deep.

Originally the house had a simpler foundation. When a basement was added, the house was set on a cement foundation. It is sided with shiplap, and roofed with composition shingles.

The entry is recessed under the main roof. A single column supports the porch roof. The entry door has a fixed light and a single panel door. A fixed diamond-shaped window lights the entry.

The house is in near-original condition except for the wrought iron railing on the porch, a replacement window in the dormer, and the cement foundation.

HISTORY

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

Enos Lincoln McCormick had this house built in c.1913. He was born in Polk County in 1865. He attended Pacific College in Newberg, and taught school for eight years. In 1894 he was elected County Recorder for Washington County and moved to Hillsboro. He served in that office until 1898. McCormick also opened a sporting goods and furniture store, and operated it for several years before selling to George Patterson. In 1906, McCormick opened a jewelry store and music shop. There was quite an interest in music in Hillsboro at this time. Several local brass bands were formed and Enos provided them with sheet music and instruments. McCormick married Geneva Helen Birdsell of Portland. They had at least one child, Eva Helen.

This house is significant for its interpretive historical value.
